1st February to 7th February, 1986

What You Will Need

The weather at Thredbo can vary greatly during summer. At Crackenback (above Thredbo, 1957 metres - typical of Main Range) on average, for five days out of seven, the temperature will be between ten degrees and eighteen degrees Celsius (maximum) for February. It can fall lower, and even a moderate wind can be very cold. Therefore you are advised to come prepared.

- Rucksack - essential
- Trousers - loose fitting, wool or wool blend
- Underwear- cotton is okay, or thermal, or wool
- Shirt - cotton or wool
- Pullover - two light are better than one heavy
- Parka - absolutely essential, with hood for preference
- Balaclava or beanie, gloves or woollen mittens
- Overpants
- Hat - Your parka may have a hood, if not, some waterproof hat that will not blow off.
- Sox - Woollen, heavy type. Two or three pairs.
- Boots - Good, well broken in. Sneakers will be acceptable.

Extras to Carry

Toilet Paper, bandage, Band Aids, Disprin, sunburn cream, safety pin, dried fruit, sweets.

Informal wear for evening or relaxing is your choice. Not too dressy.

Food

It is possible to purchase groceries at the village, but you should take cereals, tinned fruit, etc., for breakfast. Bread, butter and cheese, jam, etc., may be taken for daily lunches and breakfast, especially for first day or two. Milk, groceries, bread and frozen meat can be purchased each day (not Sunday). Joyce Larkings can be approached about any queries on 25-3242.

Evening meals can be taken at Bernti's and one or two other places, or do your own where you are staying.

You will most likely do a bit of both.

Eating out could cost \$10-00 to \$25-00 (or more) according to your appetite.

### Transport

We will try to share cars, and those hitching a ride can contribute to petrol as per club rules. If you wish to drive yourself that is okay.

We will try to contact each member to ascertain your intention and will then arrange cars.
