Eleven members and one visitor arrived at the start of the track to Mt Samaria at 9²⁰ on a magnificent morning - clear and sharp. (Left centre at 8¹⁰). Everybody made the short climb to the summit (1.2 km & 140 m rise) and were rewarded with spectacular views of the Broken River Valley and the peaks of the eastern ranges. The vehicles were then moved to the car park area near Wild Dog Creek. After a "cuppa" we followed the track to the backpackers camping area (a lovely location) and then to Wild Dog Creek falls. Returning from the falls we followed the "Wileman Track" to Camphora camping area, and after lunch to Back Creek Falls. We returned to Camphora on the "Wileman

Track" and thence along the road to the 'Old Mill' site for a 'cuppa' and back to the cars at 16⁰⁰ after walking about 14 1/2 km. (16.9 Total). The walk was generally easy with gentle grades except on the escarpment near the waterfalls and a short length near the north end of the 'Wileman Track'.

Strikingly variable flora was a feature of this walk from open dry forest with little understorey, to areas of lush growth under tall Blue, Manna and Peppermint Gums predominating, to damp wet gullies, to dry open escarpments. Many birds were heard though the density of the vegetation often made them difficult to see. Crimson Rosellas along the track and Crescent Honeyeaters on the escarpments were prominent. Large numbers of Orchids and Daisies were observed and delicate ferns and tree ferns in the gullies were a feature.

One disappointing aspect of walking this trail at this time of year is the lack of Lyrebirds calling as they are known to abound in the area. This was my first time as Leader of a walk and I thank all the walkers for their splendid co-operation and tolerance. The couple of stalwarts who made an unscheduled detour at lunch time highlighted the need for constance vigilance and the importance of monitoring stragglers. I believe the walk was a success and many of those present expressed considerable enthusiasm for a camp over weekend at approx the same time next spring.
